The Center co-sponsored two innovation summits along with the Los Angeles Alliance for Community Health and Aging (LAACHA). The

summits were held to promote digital inclusion and spur further innovation in serving older adults.

STUDY OF MASKS ADHERENCE AND SOCIAL DISTANCING (SOMAD)

The SOMAD study entailed observing Long Beach locals and visitors in several locations to understand trends in mask adherence. Between October 2020 and May 2021 Interns observed grocery stores, shopping centers, beaches, and parks and recorded social distancing and mask adherence for a National Study led by Kaiser Permanente.



7836 observations



General decline in mask use observed over time



Greater mask adherence in commercial areas than outdoor public spaces



Recommendations were made for future public awareness



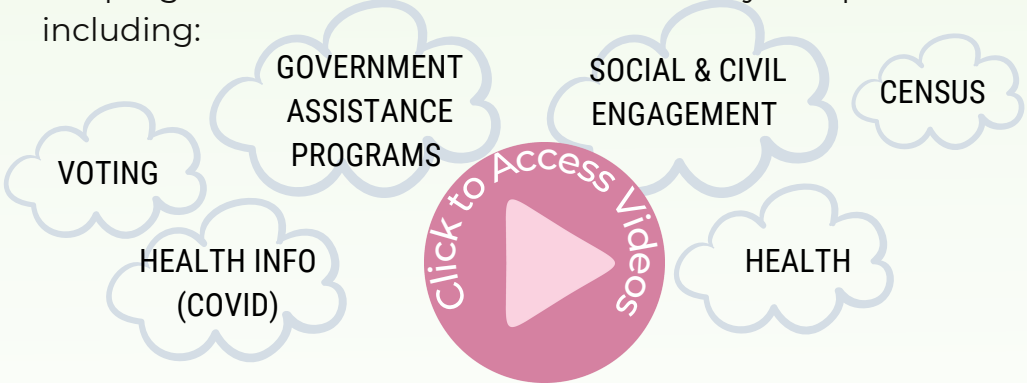

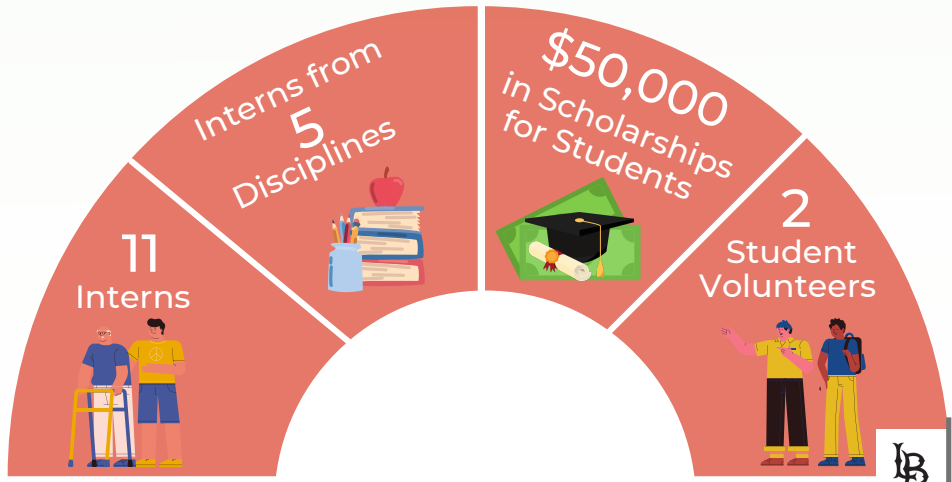

LONG BEACH SOCIAL CONNECTIVITY COLLABORATIVE (LBSSC)

LBSSC was formed with the purpose of designing, developing, and pilot testing a model for the delivery of tech-supported social connectivity strategies among diverse older adults living in low-income housing or living alone. LBSSC emerged out of the Center for Successful Aging's efforts at Lutheran Towers to address the social isolation of low-income seniors by introducing Uniper Care to Long Beach. CSA interns developed 21 informational videos in English and Spanish to guide seniors through the program. The videos focused on a variety of topics including:
