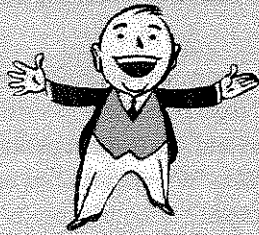

Follow the "Three Stage Path" as described on page 38. The first course you take should be UNIV 100 and in addition, one 3-unit course from each of the categories A1, A2, A3, and B2.
