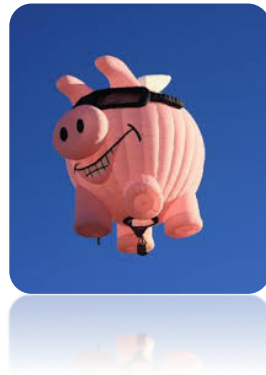

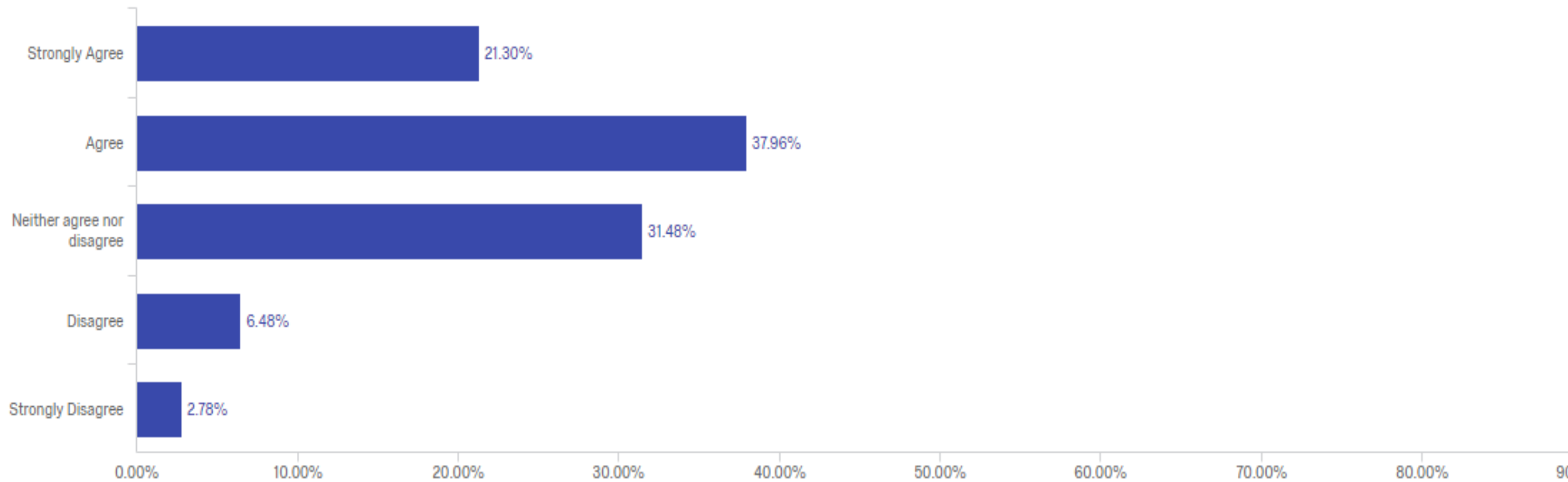

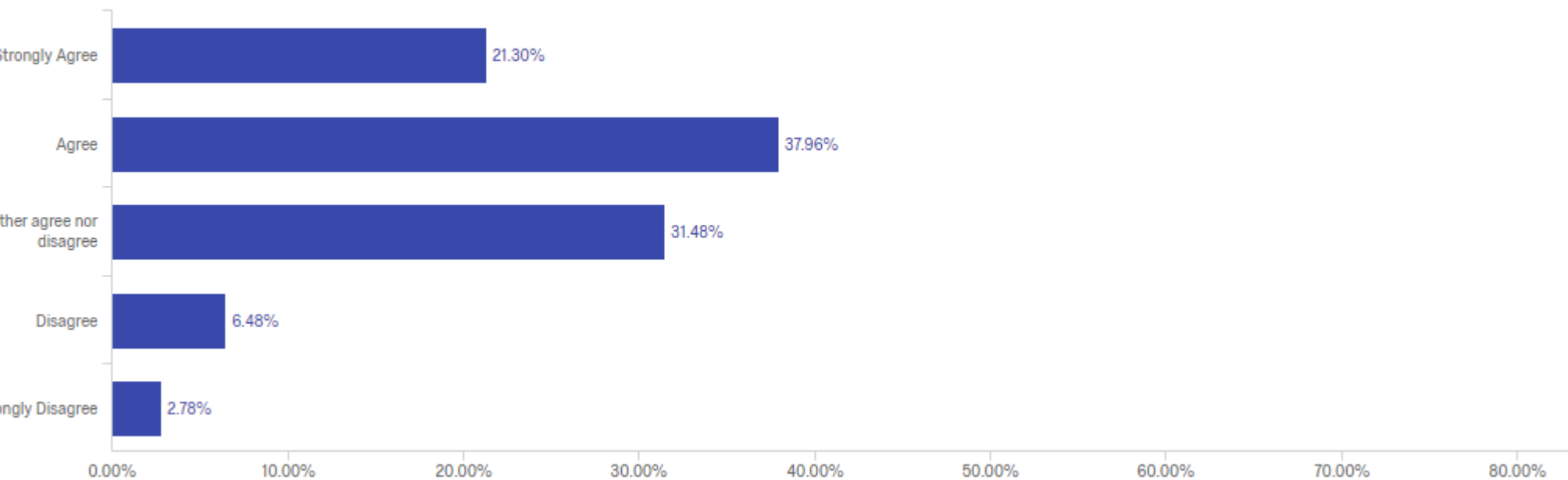
How do you define student success....

Prepare student and faculty related data reports in a way that is useful and reliable

Identify gaps in our data needs and research solutions

Answer specific college leadership team questions relating to students, faculty, research, budget, and curriculum

Communicate with all levels of our college regarding data support services, databases, and other reports available to them

Track, analyze, display, and disseminate CHHS student success markers, such as time to degree metrics, bottleneck courses, and advising intervention

Tracking, analyze, display, and disseminate CHHS faculty success markers, such as research, grants, and award activities

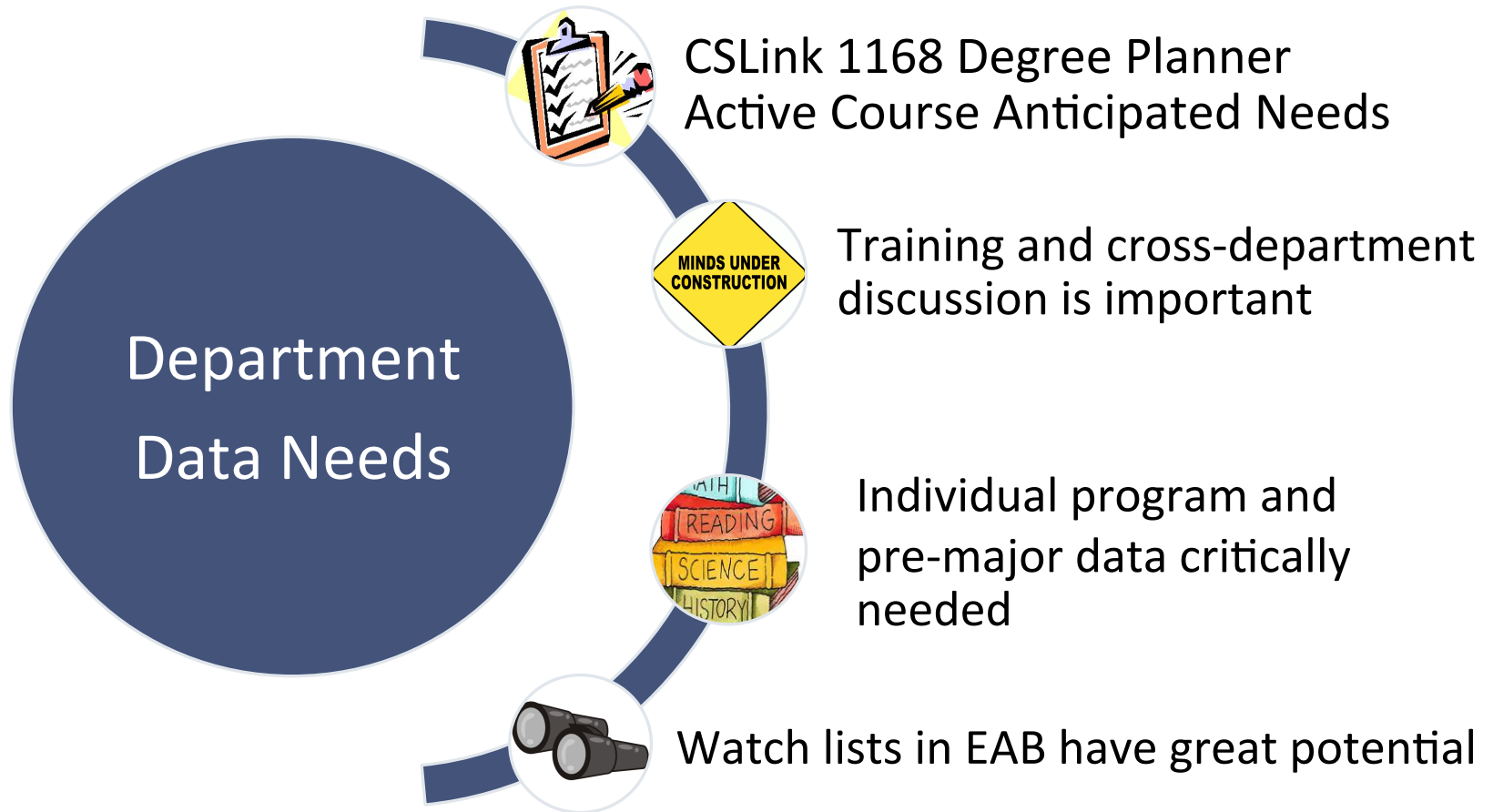

Proposal For the establishment of a CHHS Ad Hoc Committee Graduation Initiative 2025 Task Force

The Task Force (comprised of 8-10 members) will be charged with developing recommendations for CHHS policies and directives regarding the CHHS Graduation Initiative 2025. The Task Force will serve as an advisory committee to CHHS and the Dean's suite in matters concerning CHHS undergraduate student success.

The Task Force will:

- 1) Recommend CHHS goals and priorities relative to CHHS Graduation Initiative 2025 Goals, including recommendations in the areas of Curriculum, Faculty, Preparation for Post-Graduation Student Success targeting overall students success and the following CHHS 2025 Graduation Initiative targets:
 - a. the four year freshman graduation rate improved to 39%, and
 - b. the two year transfer graduation rate improved to 45%
- 2) Develop recommendations regarding improvements to the first year experience of CHHS students
- 3) Identify current student barriers for timely graduation and develop recommendations for overcoming identified barriers
- 4) Recommend funding needs relative to Student Success Funds (SEF): Part 1 proposals
- 5) Assist Departments/Schools and the Dean's office in the pursuit of the above recommendations.

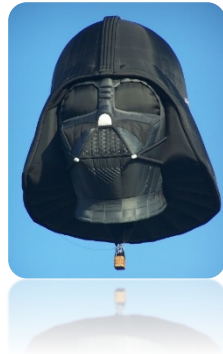
Action Items for Student Success Committee

1. Create a student survey to better meet student curriculum needs. Questions elicit responses from our students to:
 - a) Identify problems in keeping students from 4-year graduation
 - b) Identify advantages/benefits that keep students on track for 4-year graduation
 - c) Student's opinions on ideal length to graduation... to name a few

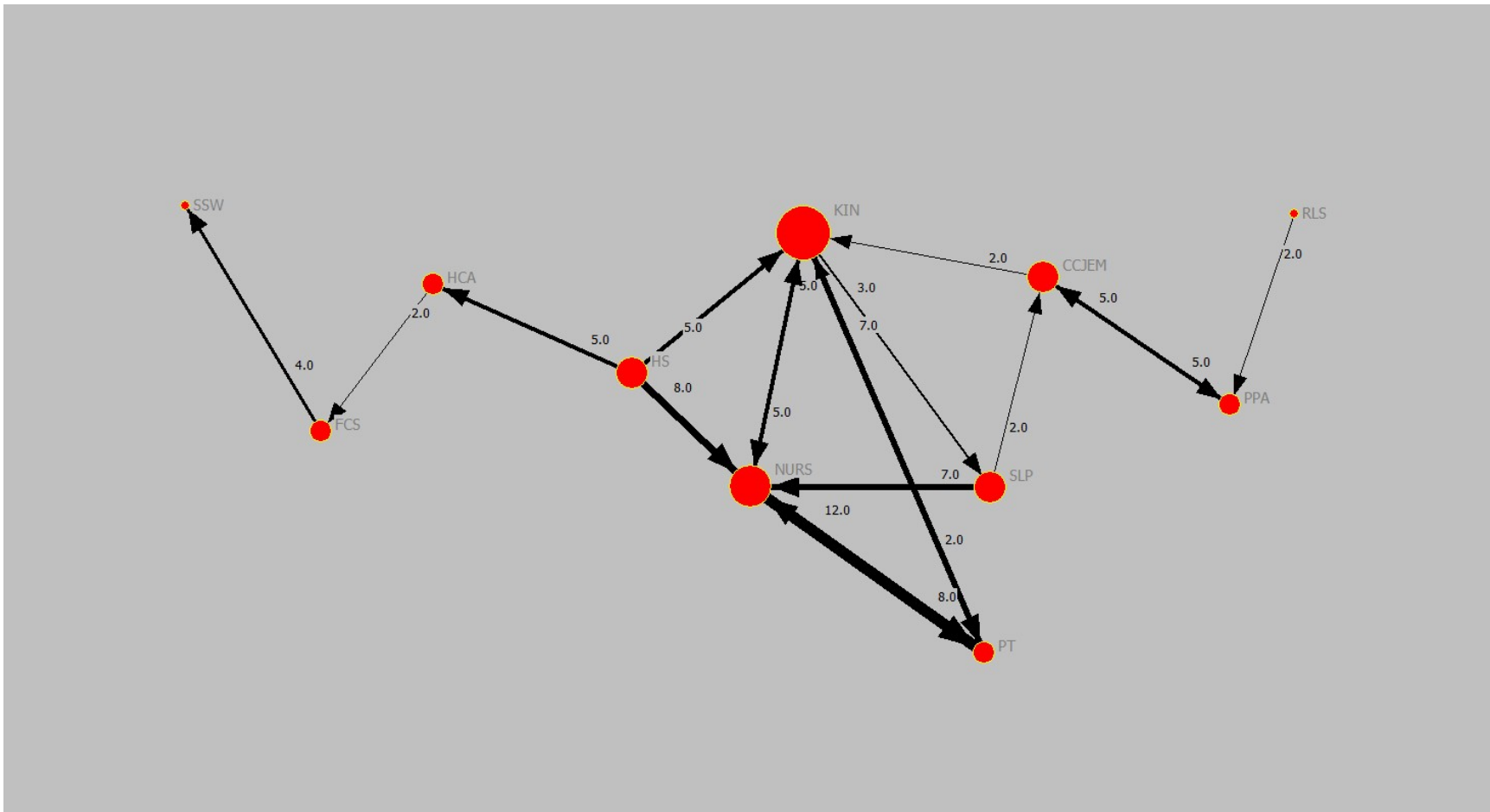
This survey will provide both quantitative and qualitative responses so that we can target problem and success areas with 4-year graduation rates. By identifying the barriers and advantages of students within our departments, we can then create/gear curriculum to the needs of our students.

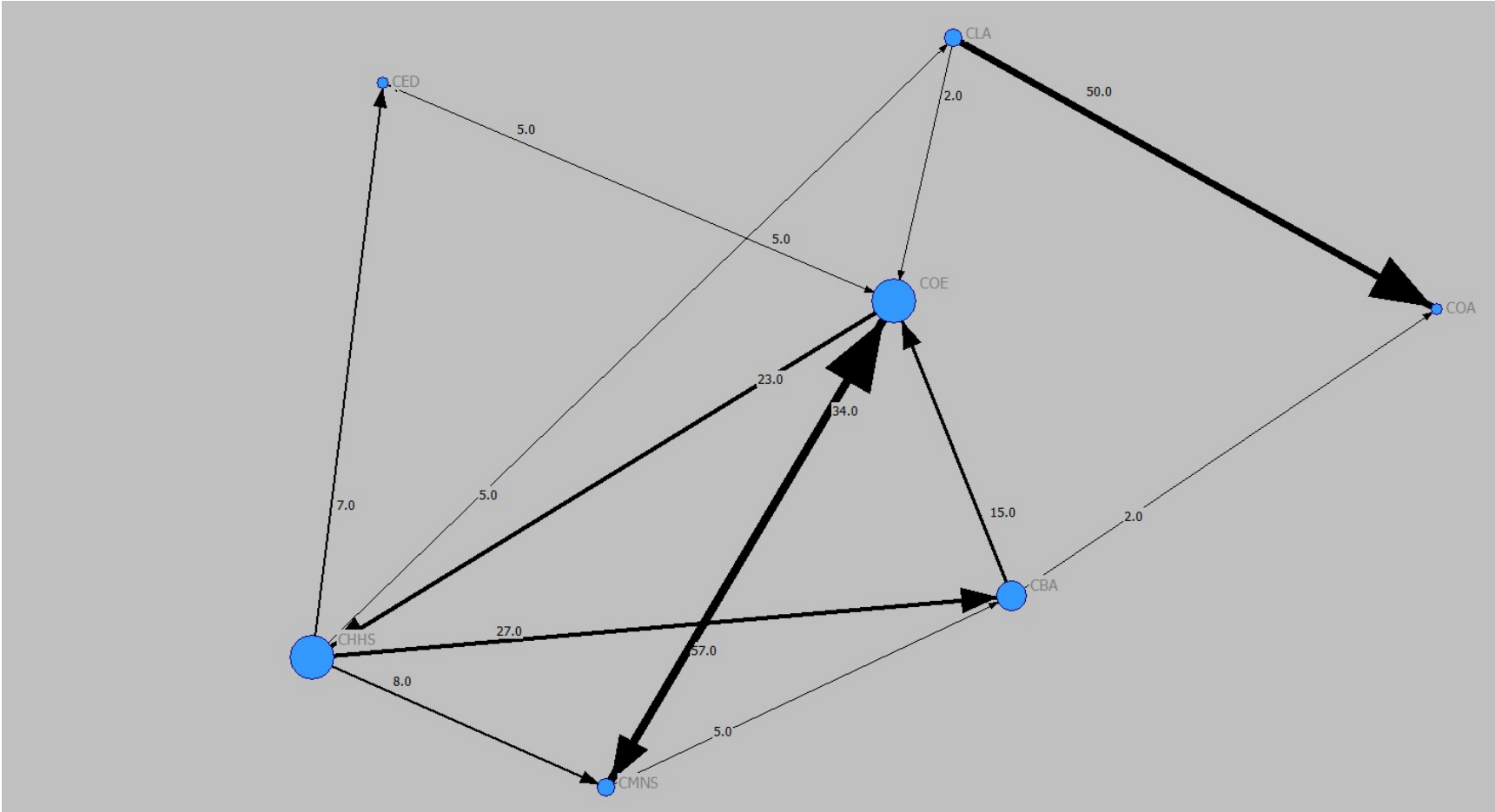


HYPOTHETICAL: WITHIN COLLEGE FLOW



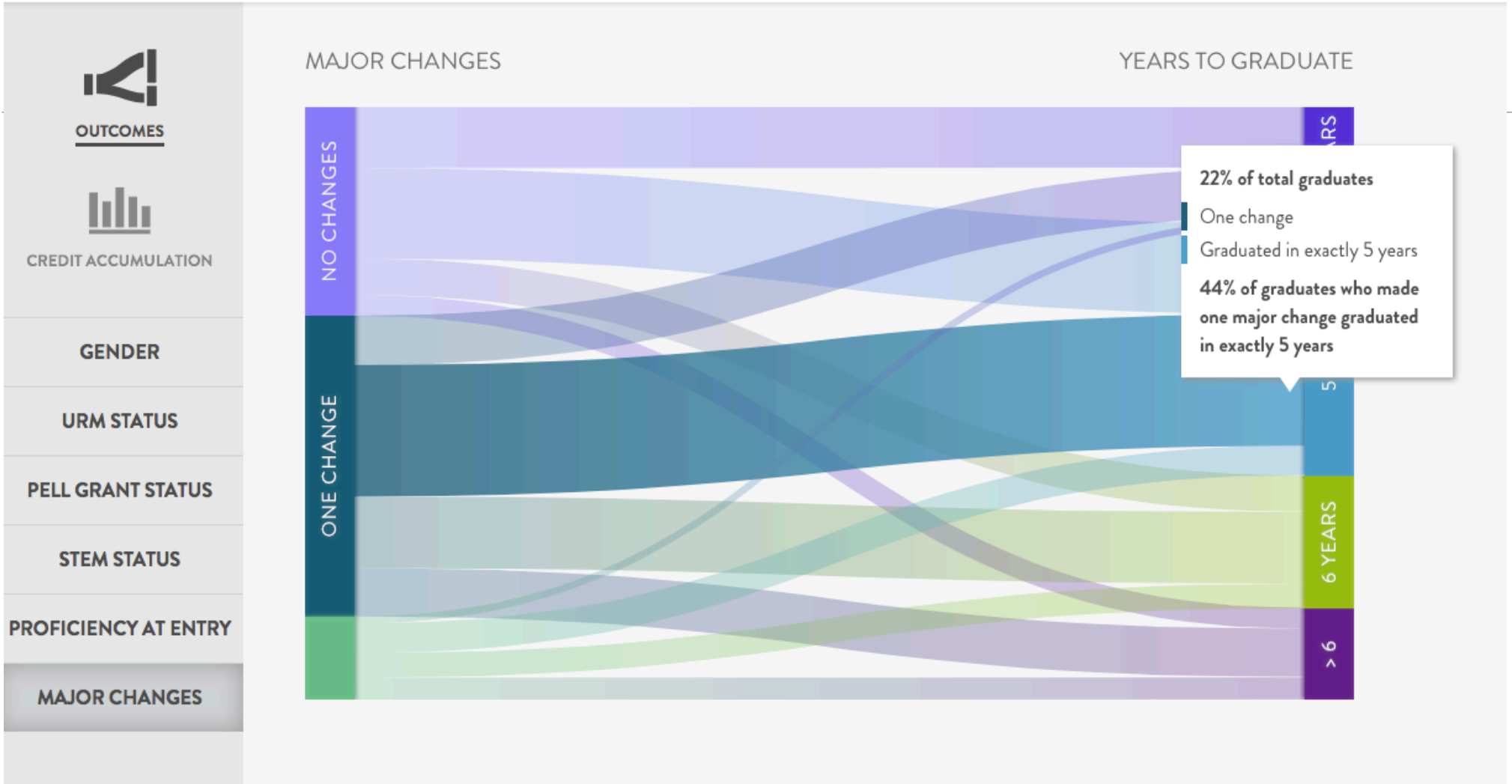
