#### 6. SPECIAL ORDERS SPECIAL ORDERS

- [Time Certain 2:10 pm] Report from CSULB President Jane Conoley- JC reports 6.1 on the Budget with final details received yesterday. Estimated \$11M structural deficit for the year. TPM (time, place and manner) messages have gone out from the CO. it is in the meet & confer process at this time. Our persistence rate increased 1%, we are the  $2^{nd}$  highest in the system. Temporarily the Ombuds position is transiting into the conflict resolution. This is a reporting position unlike the Ombuds position. A work group is being formed with enrollment growth. Full reimbursement only occurs for 12 units and over. Look at an administrative change to summer stateside, which would allow us to "count" the students with regards to reimbursement. Mandated for other positions to hire include Tribal relations coordinator, and more investigators for Title IX. An extended cabinet will explore the TPM. Planned Beach convenings about Shared governance are forthcoming. NS says the ASCSU senators will be speaking on TPM at their next meeting, any university concerns can be addressed. Protest are intended to disrupt. A question about the conflict resolution position to replace the Ombuds position, answer is yes.
- 6.2 Report from CFA Co-President, Shelly Collins- SC presents on CFA accomplishments including parental leave and salary increases. They are working with FA on guidance for lecture faculty to become Tenure track. Attempting to bring down the percentage of CAPS counselors to student ratio.
- 6.3 Report from ASCSU Senator Norbert Schürer- NS reports on what ASCSU does. The ASCSU writes resolutions, not policies. GI 2025 is now "Year of

Engagement" He lists some of the passed resolutions from May. This year topics will include, Shared governance, AI, Associate degrees, Cal-GETC, First-year experience, Black Excellence Initiative. Email any of the three ASCSU senators with questions. KK asks about the proposed associate degrees; will the pricing be different from the Bachelors. NS says this will be discussed. EK states they are also discussing dual enrollment with high schools.

Warren, seconded. KC reports on the reason to move this to a STEM designation. Employers are requesting STEM designation for graduates. A survey was conducted from faculty and students with overwhelming support. Self-study also recommended this. CB asks of Math requirement. BK asks about CIP code. 7.5 [Time Certain 3:15 pm] Proposed Internship Policy (AS 1223-23/CEPC) -- FIRST READING

Guests: Juan Benitez, Executive Director, Center for Community Engagement; Michelle Chang, Director, Academic Internships Office- moved by N. Schurer, seconded. JB and JC present on this policy. Background on policy, EO 1064 from CO, one of the requirements is for each campus to have their own internship policy. Service-learning policy also required by this EO. Definition of what an academic internship is, what it does not refer to. Current process for student filled placements versus this policy are examined. processes are in alignment with the CO executive order. AM asks of "contractual agreement" JB explains. It is the formalization of the process. SA asks about previous policy, answer there was no previous policy, thus we were out of compliance. Codifying Best Practices is done with this policy. Allows for better tracking of hours also. SO asks about international internships. Does this policy cover these placements? JB say yes. BK asks about the word "placement". Moves to 2<sup>nd</sup> reading at next AS meeting.

[Time Certain 3:30 pm] Revision of PS 21-09 General Education Policy (AS-

1244-24/GEGC/CEPC) -- FIRST READING Guests: Jeff Bentley, Chair, CEPC; Nicollette Brant, Chair, GEGC- moved by N. Schurer, seconded. JB presents the revised GE policy which was done in collaboration with GEGC. He presents the Cal-GETC standards to create a "singular lower division GE pathway" this was revised into E) 1101 which needed to be integrated into the CSU Ge policy. Previous had 39 units, now has 34 units. Section names/letters were changed. The removal of the 3<sup>rd</sup> arts and humanities, remove lifelong learning. A composition requirement was added, CSU removed the composition element. Upper division is untouched, only cosmetic changes. Total GE units now 43. JB mentions Oral Communication and requirements. Foundations and the timing of taking them is explained. Overall GE GPA is presented also. NS mentions that FYE should be considered when examining this policy revision. NS asks what the Academic Senate should do. JB/NB the language of Oral communication has been changed; this will be one of the major changes in language. The critical thinking section may be revised says NB. There are only 4 places where we can make changes due to the EO. JB suggests a Transfer Experience course in addition to FYE. Moves to 2<sup>nd</sup> reading at next AS meeting.
