The California Junior Science and Humanities Symposium (CSJSHS) is a STEM research competition that serves as the regional qualifier for the National JSHS symposium.

Junior Science and Humanities Symposium (JSHS) is a Department of Defense sponsored STEM program (U.S. Office of the Secretary of Defense and the U.S. Departments of the Army, Navy, and Air Force). Promotes original research and experimentation in the sciences, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) at the high school level through competition at regional and national levels in eight core STEM areas.

- Students in 9th–12th grade

- The 2025 CSJSH will be held on the California State University Long Beach campus on February 20<sup>th</sup> -21<sup>st</sup>.
  - Research Paper abstracts due November 22<sup>nd</sup>
  - The registration deadline for poster presenters is February 15<sup>th</sup>.

- All expense paid trip to Nationals for oral presenters
