"If I want to become a dietitian, what are my options at CSULB now that there is no longer a DPD program?"

There are several options available to students once they graduate with their degree

Option #1	Students currently completing their B.S. in Nutrition and Food Science are eligible to apply to the Graduate Program in Applied Nutrition and Dietetics (GP) through the <u>blended track</u> <u>at CSULB</u> . This occurs during the final year of the B.S. Visit the <u>webpage</u> for more info.
Option #2	Students who graduate from CSULB are eligible to apply to the GP through the traditional track. Applications open in August, and close September 1st. Visit the <u>webpage</u> for more info.
Option #3	After graduating, CSULB students may earn a DPD Verification Statement by completing requisite coursework through <u>CSULA's</u> <u>Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Nutritional Science</u> . The program accepts up to 8 credits, and upon completing remaining courses, students will be issued a DPD Verification Statement from CSULA. Contact the Post-Bac Director <u>here</u> .
Option #4 (for students who enrolled before fall 2024)	For CSULB students enrolled previous to fall 2024, but were not able to finish coursework before the DPD closure, CSUN has agreed to host these students and allow them to complete required coursework for a DPD Verification Statement, issued by CSUN. Contact the program director <u>here</u> .
