**Re: Travel Advisory for International Students During Winter Break 2024–2025**

Dear International Students,

As you prepare for winter break and make plans to travel internationally, we want to provide important guidance to ensure a smooth return to the United States for the Spring 2025 semester. While nothing definitive can be predicted regarding future U.S. immigration policies, it is essential to remain informed and prepared. As in the past, every new US administration may make changes to immigration policies which potentially may impact immediate and unexpected changes to entry/re-entry procedures for certain individuals.

With the U.S. presidential inauguration scheduled for January 20, 2025, we strongly recommend the following:

1. **Return Early:** Aim to re-enter the United States well in advance of January 20 to minimize the risk of being affected by any sudden changes in policy or heightened scrutiny at ports of entry.
2. **Carry Proper Documentation:** Ensure you have all necessary travel documents, including your valid passport, visa, I-20 or DS-2019 form with a current travel signature, and supporting documentation relevant to your visa status.
3. **Stay Informed on Policy Updates:** Frequently check official websites for travel updates, such as the [U.S. Department of State Embassies](#), the [U.S. Department of Homeland Security](#), and keep an eye out for communication from the CIE International Student and Scholar Services office for the latest information.
