- 7. Mini-grants and summer stipends Call for Proposals begins September 18, 2022 (Monday) Mae shared and explained the review process of MGSS using UMGSSC Info-Ready Online Review Guide. Members should follow the instructions on Info-Ready to complete the review. If members have questions or problems navigating the Info-Ready, please reach out to Mae for help.

Mae explained the 4 routing processes of the award. First, the College Review Committee review will review and score each proposal. Second, the college review committee will standardize the score. Third, the college review committee will submit recommendations to the Dean. Fourth, the UMGGS will review the proposal and read the comments from the college review committee and Dean and make the decision to approve or not approve application for award.

Each proposal will be assigned to 3 reviewers within the committee. Each reviewer (committee member) will review about 7 proposals depending on the number of proposals received. Each proposal will be reviewed by at least one reviewer from the same college. The committee will not rank the proposals, only approve, or not approve recommendations to approve. Committee members raised concerns about if there are proposals received the same number approvals, how will the committee rank the proposals. (The concern of proposal ranking was clarified — proposals with 3 approvals from the Committee reviewers will be top ranking and automatically awarded, if more funding is available, the proposals with at least 2 approvals will also be awarded).

Lastly, the committee will only review recommended proposals from the college.
