FISCAL MANAGEMENT & PARTNERSHIPS

We partner with representatives from across the K16 education pipeline and community organizations to expand educational and career opportunities for students from low-income families or schools with low college participation rates.





CAREER EXPLORATION ACADEMIES

In partnership with corporations, GEAR UP designs 5-week after-school academies focused on career exploration. Students receive hands-on training, solve real-world problems, connect with leading professionals, and visit job sites.



STEAM Academy

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) concepts by solving various real-world problems in storybook form. **15** students coded a video game, programmed a 3D printer, and took home a FREE laptop.



F.A.D.E (Fashion & Design Entrepreneurship)

42 students learned about fashion, design, and entrepreneurship, and created their own fashion brand online storefront.



LEGO Engineering

86 students learned engineering concepts by constructing different objects out of LEGOs.



R.A.C.E (Racing & Automotive Career Exploration)

25 students explored careers in the automotive industry, learned about infrastructure/city planning, and got handson experience in auto design. Additionally, students went on a field trip to the Petersen Automotive Museum.



High School Bound Summit

GEAR UP focuses on critical points of transition throughout students' educational journey. This year, we hosted over **150** students and their families at the High

Future Fair

GEAR UP believes that finding your purpose and discovering your calling starts now! Our Student Success Team worked closely with each of our **850** 8th graders to complete a 3-part college and career exploration portfolio, My Big Future. Over several months, students identified their values, interests, and motivations and designed a path towards their dream career. The Future Fair was an opportunity to showcase their career aspirations, network with career professionals, and learn about what's next when planning their career.

PARENT AND FAMILY PROGRAMMING

Going to college is a family affair.

GEAR UP utilizes a collaborative and integrated approach when helping the adults at home become more engaged in their student's education. Since 2021, family participation has <u>tripled</u>, delivering over **800** hours of services to nearly **300** parents/guardians. Our team offers workshop series, targeted academies, college visits, and community outreach events.

My Story Matters: Plus Me Project

In partnership with the Plus Me Project, parents were introduced to the power of storytelling through "My Story Matters" Journal, using personal stories to advocate, support, and inspire their students and communities.



Supporting English Learners

In collaboration with the Parent Organization Network and NLMUSD, we enrolled 27 parents/guardians in a 6 week series to help them understand the English language reclassification process, their role in their child's reclassification, and ELPAC results and reclassification criteria.

Financial Literacy & College Saving

In partnership with LBS Financial Credit Union, parents learned about budgeting, credit scores, and how they can start saving for college today.


