 - d) Discussed AI Technologies on Campus:
 - i) Discussing AI Integration and Tool Implementation
 - (1) Bryon noted the development of the "virtual assistant" for Canvas courses is in testing phase; potential Canvas implementation forthcoming.
 - (a) See FACT Minutes from 2023-2024 for details.

- (i) Bryon and Shariq agreed to get FACT a demo, if possible.
 - (b) IT now has Video calling for support.
 - (i) Video calls with IT support team protects individual account security
 - (c) Ongoing discussions with Microsoft and the Chancellor's office on AI tools.
 - (i) CSU system collaboration on tool implementation and purchase decisions.
 - ii) Microsoft Copilot Licensing and Usage Discussion
 - (1) Alexis and Bryon discussed Microsoft's Copilot's inclusion in the campus-wide licensing agreement.
 - (a) MS Copilot is not free; it is part of the MS/CSULB campus agreement.
 - (b) Built on Chat GPT 4o, CSULB's version does not save conversations and does not incorporate questions or answers in the public Copilot corpus.
 - (c) If CSULB faculty/students/staff use an AI chatbot, FACT recommends CSULB's Copilot for safety.
 - iii) Chatbot searching vs. Academic Databases
 - (1) Alexis discussed using AI chatbots to search for peer-reviewed articles
 - (a) Gave overview of limitations and copyright issues
 - (i) AI academic search bot Perplexity in lawsuit with *Forbes Magazine* over copyright
 - (b) Brian noted potential for AI tools to hallucinate results; Bryon and Alexis assured CSULB Library's catalog OneSearch would not.
 - (i) Bryon and Alexis suggested that students, faculty, and staff use CSULB University Library resources for safety and reliability
 - (ii) Alexis noted that students and faculty should contact their CSULB Librarian for instruction in using the databases and interlibrary loan.
- e) Alexis announced her Sabbatical from March 1, 2025 – June 30, 2025.
