  - 6.1 Report from President Conoley TIME CERTAIN 2:10 PM- JC presents that she is working on budget advocacy, in the unlikely case of ICE on campus, protocols were sent out yesterday.

Notifications from the federal government regarding Grants, no grants can be about DEI, ORSP is checking all current grants for possible action. Possible reduction of Grants forthcoming. NSF Grants asked for DEI information, the PI for these grants will examine for editing. Moot court won another National Championship recently. California futures reports we are #8 on Social Mobility index. This will be used for Pell Grant advocacy. COTA won an award recently which will be announced soon. DP asks about indirect costs for Grants and is there a plan to save jobs for these Grants. NS asks about the CSU's investment in AI. How will that impact faculty and students. This is a one-year funding, JC states.

- 6.2 <u>Report</u> from "Kelly Janousek, CFA LB Faculty Rights Chair"- KJ reports on CFA working on "liberate the CSU" Grant funding is under attack. Higher education DEI initiatives are under attack. Other CSU's are not offering contracts to part time lecturer faculty. AI does affect things like intellectual property, CFA wants to ensure critical thinking continues in higher education TPM policy and Academic freedom, what can be talked about in open spaces are issues. Attacks on Ethnic Studies are occurring. Immigration task force happening to be ready to help students as needed. Better mental health resources requested. Bargaining has begun, roadshow next week. Updates and options will be presented then. Salary issues continue; getting faculty the correct compensation is being worked on. Unionwide town hall coming up.

  - 8.2 Proposed revision of PS 95-07: Policy on Master's Level Program Culminating Activities (AS-1152-19/CEPC) -- SECOND READING- resume on Line 54. JC amendment moved and seconded. Comments for and against presented. Vote on amendment, yes-18 no-31. Amendment fails. Line 58, JC amendment, moved and seconded. NS speaks in favor, seconded. passes by acclamation.
  - 8.3 [Time Certain 3:30 pm] Information Session and Vote on the proposed revision of PS 12-12: Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR)-(AS-1207-23/CEPC)- in two parts: a policy and a committee charge Guests: Jeff Bentley, Chair, Curriculum and Educational Policies Council; Loretta Ramirez, Chair, GWARC; Lori Brown, Campus GWAR Coordinator and Past GWARC Chair; Courtney Stammler,

Faculty, Program Coordinator & GWAR Advisor- NH explains to Senate that after this presentation the Senate will vote on which version of the policy to move forward on, the GWARC version or the CEPC version. CM asks about the vote part in a procedural sense. NS states that he agrees with what NH stated and EC did agree to vote on this. Members of EC speak on this issue.
