 - With holidays coming up, great time to integrate sustainability efforts into your planning.
 - Events have major impacts on our health and environment; lots of waste gets generated.
 - Sustainability = is the intersection of Environment, Equity, and Economy:

 - Save resources, energy, reduce waste, support local economy, creates inclusion
 - Meets campus goals = Beach 2030, Carbon Neutral by 2040, Gold rating in STARS
 - Green Events Program: can get training= certification available—sign up today!

• Kristin Bonetati / Patrick Joyce- Bookstore Refresh

- Bookstore refresh project by June 2025 (see slides attached- renderings look darker than the reality, just FYI). Bookstore will remain open throughout remodel as usual.
- The Bookstore will NOT be moving for the USU remodel.
 - Need to vacate 2nd floor of bookstore in prep for remodeling of USU because it will be turned into a lounge and study space for students / partner with ASi
 - Hired a designer to figure out everything to make sure the traffic flow is good and looks nice
 - LBS Credit Union will occupy left side of bookstore
 - Student ID space will have a dedicated area along with Printing & Design shop
 - Textbooks area will be smaller as more books are going digital .Computer store will look more like an Apple store since that's what it mostly sells
 - New checkout area- more like individual cashier booths rather than a big counter
 - New big windows up front for natural light people can see inside
 - REMINDER: 10% off for all faculty & staff all the time even on top of sale items (except some restrictions e.g., computer equip). Be sure to show your ID card when checking out and be patient with student workers who sometimes forget
