# TEACHING MASTER OF ARTS (TMAC) PROGRAM TEACHING ASSOCIATE IN COMPOSITION DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH California State University, Long Beach

#### **Purpose**

The primary purpose of the Teaching Associate (TA) Program in the Department of English is to provide professional training and supervision for aspiring college-level teachers of composition. The TA Program is a carefully constructed series of experiences--including supervised teaching, group discussions, and workshops--all designed to improve the teaching of composition.

#### **Eligibility**

Applicants should be currently enrolled in the CSULB Department of English M.A. Program; preference may be given to students who have completed at least one semester of graduate work prior to their TA appointment. Applicants need a minimum "B" average in all upper-division and graduate-level courses to meet the M.A. requirement.

#### **Required Application Materials**

Candidates for appointment must submit the following documents to the Department Office by the announced deadline:

- 1) A cover letter stating intent of application, including the applicant's career objectives, related background, and current e-mail address.
- 2) Completed application form (attached)
- 3) A completed SC-1 form (attached)
- 4) A résumé or vita
- 5) Three letters of recommendation from current or former instructors and/or supervisors, one of which MUST be from an off-campus reference;
- 6) Official transcripts showing B.A. degree completion
- 7) A sample essay/article of no more than 12 pages

Teaching Associates will be chosen by the TA Program Committee, normally comprised of the TA Supervisor, the Composition Coordinator, and department composition specialists.

#### Training and Supervision

Before fall semester begins, TAs will meet several times with the TA Supervisor to prepare for their classes. In the first semester of appointment, TAs will attend a weekly seminar with the TA Supervisor, who will monitor and evaluate classroom instruction, class assignments, and grading practices. They must also enroll for one unit in ENGL 697 for each semester of teaching.
