A Note From Our Artistic Director

The stage for *Polaroid Stories* is often like a labyrinth and aptly so: for this play is an intense journey. The script is a collage of verbatim interviews that playwright Naomi lizuka conducted with homeless youth and young sex workers in the late 1990s, and it recasts those people she met as mythological characters from Ovid's classic, *Metamorphoses*. So, we hear the stories of Orpheus, Eurydice, Echo, Narcissus, Dionysus and others — all set in an "underworld" where these young people have been pushed to the margins of society. Story-telling and myth-making are one of the ways they can escape reality, reinvent themselves, and survive. Gods behave in foolish, fallible ways like humans; and humans act like gods with often fatal results.

There are two ways that this 1997 play feels completely connected to our current moment. First, although this play was generated from interviews with homeless youth twenty years ago, the situation today is just as urgent: 1 out of every 10 students in the CSU system is homeless or housing-insecure; LA County's homeless population increased 23% last year; and youths are the fastest-growing homeless age group (with those 18 to 24 up 64%, followed by those under 18 at 41%). Second, the gender politics that this play grapples with have become even more powerful over the past month as the #MeToo movement builds in momentum. This play does not shy away from the abusive relationships that the female characters are living in; and the heart of the play is about the ways they each try to confront and break out of those oppressive relationships. I thank director Eric Hoff and the entire team for telling these urgent – and disturbingly relevant - stories through the poetry of lizuka's gorgeous play.
